

Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you to the Reception and KS1 parents who joined us for **Stay and Play** yesterday morning. Particular thanks to the parents who filled in observations for the children's Reception Class Learning Journey diaries or who talked to us about **ways to help your child at home**. This week has been our Anti Bullying Week. We have spent time in assembly making sure we know:

- What Bullying Is
- What Bullying Isn't
- What we do about Bullying TELL!

I have attached some information about this to the end of this newsletter so that you can also talk to your child about it. Inevitably the younger children take a while to understand the difference between bullying and the occasional upset they have experienced, so don't be alarmed if they suddenly start using the word!

To help us understand about bullying, why people bully and the role of the bystander in bullying we had a **theatre production**, **Hope**, for Years 2 to 6. The children enjoyed the performance and KS2 joined in really well with the follow up workshops. We were complimented by the theatre company who said, "You can tell these children are used to theatre, they were engaged from the word go and they really got it!"



Our theme this year for Anti Bullying Week is **Shine a Light on Bullying** to get the message home that it is always important to tell. This year's reminder present was a little torch and School Council decided it would be fun to have an event in the hall where we uncovered a hidden message using our **torches** and then got to read by torchlight. Thanks School Council – we enjoyed it!





Yesterday Year 5 were visited by Bryony, a scientist from the **European Space Agency**. Inspired by Tim Peake's visit to space, the children took part in science experiments using UV light and even got to smell a comet. Thank you to Mr Marshall for arranging this exciting visitor.





I know many of you have been keen to help us improve the conditions for children walking to and from school, as well as for local residents by tackling **speeding and parking** issues. There is a **public meeting at 7pm at HEART on Tuesday** to discuss these issues and try to come up with a plan. It would be good to have school representation there. Thank you.

Finally, I hope to see you at the **FOSOPS café** this afternoon raising funds for the Leeds Children's Heart Surgery Fund and at **Shire Oak Sunday**.
