Dear Parents and Carers

It is good to be getting into the swing of school life again. This week we were very pleased to hold our first **House Team** meetings for over a year and a half. All the children in school are in one of 5 teams (lions, leopards, giraffes, rhinos and elephants). The Year 6 children in each team are the team captains and they set a good example, encourage children to work hard for their team and help them when we work in teams (such as on sports days and on house team hobby half days).
