



**Dear Parents and Carers**

## Shire Oak vs. Allerton

It was a bleary day when Allerton finally rolled into Headingley. The rain was just starting when the game kicked off at 15:50 on the 9<sup>th</sup> of February, and both teams seemed evenly matched...
